

# Supply List for Quilt Canada 2019 Workshop

**Workshop Title:** Ribbon Scarves with Machine Stitching

Using Sulky® Solvy and machine embroidery is an incredibly open process and will allow for a lot of variety in our finished pieces. With the technique being so open, you can bring in a variety of materials.

## **Your \$30 Kit will contain:**

Embroidery Floss: For hand stitching

Hand Sewing Needles: Also for hand stitching

Thread: polyester machine embroidery threads.

Sulky® Water-soluble Stabilizer (Solvly): Each person will get 1 yard Sulky® Sticky Fabri Solvy and 1 yard Sulky® Solvy to make their ribbon scarf as a part of the class project. Small samples of a variety of stabilizers will be provided for quick samples.

## **In addition to the kit you will need:**

Sewing machine\*

Sewing Machine Feet: Free motion quilting foot and Clear foot/or regular presser foot.

Ribbons: 3 different ribbons will be the base of your project. Bring in 4 yards of each type. Ribbons can be thick or thin and can be any colour/material you would like.

## **Optional Supplies:**

Scrap fabrics: Bring materials that you love. I know I have bins of beautiful fabric I'm just saving- and you might too! Bring some of your beauties to integrate into your project. Small amounts of fabric are all that's needed for this project and smaller pieces (1"x1") will work well.

Scrap yarns: Do you have scraps from previous projects that you are saving? This technique is an excellent way to recycle some of these materials.

Sewing threads: These will be used for stitching your piece together. Bring in some threads that will fit with your colour scheme but also bring in some unexpected colours.

Roving: This looks excellent with machine embroidery.

Extras: Anything that you would like to include like buttons, sequins, lace, trim, thin wire etc. are welcome.
