Ultra Solvy

Felting needles

Tulle in several colours

Cording, pre-felt and Tear Easy

Teacher's supplies for student's use as needed:

505 spray

Assorted Yarns

Assorted Confetti scraps & bits

Assorted tulle in colours not in kit

Threads as per supply list + golden yellow for eagle beak

Pigma pens for eagle eye

Student Supplies:

- Sewing machine* with extension table, extra bobbins, free hand quilting foot, and piping and/or zipper foot. Machine must be capable of doing zigzag.
- Standard sewing supplies: including seam ripper, regular and fine appliqué pins, quilting gloves.
- Pencil, eraser and drawing paper.
- Scissors: two pair, both small with sharp points one for paper, one for fabric.
- Machine needles: Schmetz Microtex, sizes 10 & 12; Top Stitching, size 12 & 14.
- Small cutting board old if possible (9" x 12" sufficient), board cleaner (if you have one), fabric cutter.
- Ultra fine black permanent marker, Pigma pen in a medium shade and another in a

fine point black.

- Container to hold water, such as a small bucket or large ice cream tub.
- Hand sewing supplies: Fine appliqué needle, needle threader (optional).
- 2 small hand towels.
- Fabric weights, small screw driver, tweezers, approx. 15 baggies
- Empty paper towel roll, plastic bag that it fits in and a rubber band to wrap it tight.
- Scrap batik fabrics (no scrap is too small) in white, black and various values of browns and grey plus a few tiny bits of yellow gold for beak.
- Small piece of thin poly batt, at least 8" x 12".
- Piece of brown fabric suitable for a tree trunk, approx. 4" x 12".
- For your comfort if desired: an extra light for your workspace.
- Healthy scraps or fat quarter each of white, off-white, very light grey, medium grey, dark grey, dark brown and black fabric. A very small piece of yellow gold for eagle beak and feet.
- Thread: Fine 60 – 80 wt bobbin thread: Off-white, light grey, medium grey, dark grey and black. The medium grey, dark grey and off-white are the most important if you need to purchase but don't wish to invest in 5 new spools.
- Thread: monofilament or invisible thread: clear and smoke.
- Thread: 30 - 50 wt decorative threads: suggested colours should include: white, off-white, several shades of grey, 3-4 shades of medium to dark brown, 2-3 shades of golden yellow and black.

Note: The supply list has been made assuming you will be making a 3D eagle as shown on the supply list. If you wish you may try your hand at another object of your choosing. If so, bring decorative threads and fabrics as described above in several shades of the colours needed for your 3D object as well as a clear photo or drawing.
