There are two different ways to make a shimmering quilt: You can alternate large prints with tone-on-tone fabrics or use only large prints.

For the Large Print only option: Small: Up to 25 Large Print fabrics

- Medium: Up to 39 Large Print fabrics.
- Large: Up to 61 Large Print fabrics (Note: A large quilt cannot be completed in a 2-day class)

For the Large Print and Alternating Block option:

- Small: 9 Large Print fabrics and up to 24 Alternating Fabrics
- Medium: 15 Large Print fabrics and up to 36 Alternating Fabrics
- Large: 25 Big Print fabrics and up to 60 Alternating Fabrics

If choosing to use the Alternating option, each finished block needs two (similar in colour tone-on-tone fabrics.) Alternating fabrics can be reused if you wish to use fewer fabrics.

Your fabrics should have a variety of high contrast and value.
FQ collections may work if they have high contrast and value.
$10^{\prime \prime} \times 10^{\prime \prime}$ cream or white muslin - you will be drawing on this with a permanent marker

## Basic Supplies Required:

- $12^{\prime \prime} \times 18^{\prime \prime}$ cutting mat and rotary cutter with new blade
- $8.5^{\prime \prime}$ x $8.5^{\prime \prime}$ ruler or larger
- 6 " x 6 " ruler
- 1 " $\times 12$ " ruler (does not need to be a clear cutting ruler)
- Another small cutting mat that you don't mind drawing on with a permanent marker
- Permanent marker - Regular tip - Sharpie is recommended.
- Sewing kit: straight pins (lots of pins), seam ripper
- Fabric marking pencils (No FriXion ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ pens please) or chalk liners for both light and dark fabrics
- Small scissors and thread snips
- Fleece lined tablecloth (1 or 2) or flannel bedsheet. This is your design wall and should fit your preferred quilt size.
- Safety pins - to secure blocks and pieces to your design wall to take home after workshop (Pool Noodle optional - to roll up design wall to easily transport)
- Piecing thread - neutral colour
- Spray starch or sizing such as Best Press, etc
